

# Assistance Animal Screening Guide

Our aim is for you to have a safe and seamless experience at Brisbane Airport. This guide will help you understand our security screening process.

**i** You and your animal may be screened separately or together.

**i** You may ask to be screened in a private search room at any time.

**For you and your assistance animal to be screened together, at least two alternative screening methods will be used for the full length of your body.**

- If a detector alarms, you will be asked to remove any items that can be easily x-rayed, and / or a frisk search will be conducted to clear the area.
- If you can't be screened by a metal detector because of a medical device or implant, a frisk search will be required to be conducted instead.

**Our officer will physically inspect your assistance animal, its harness, collars and attachments.**

- The officer will run their hands along each side of the collar or harness worn by the assistance animal to inspect it.
- We may also x-ray any bags attached to the assistance animal
