Assistance Animal Screening Guide

Our aim is for you to have a pleasant and stress-free experience at Brisbane Airport.

This guide will help you understand our security procedures.

- 1 We won't separate you from your assistance animal at anytime.
- Persons accompanied by an assistance animal cannot be screened by means of a walk-through metal detector or body scanner.
- 1 You may ask to be screened in a private search room at any time.



You will be screened by means of a hand-held metal detector for the full length of your body.

- If the metal detector alarms, you will be asked to remove any items that can be easily divested, and/or a frisk search will be conducted to clear the area.
- If you can't be screened by the metal detector because of a medical device or implant, a frisk search will be required to be conducted instead.



Our officer will inspect your assistance animal, the physical harness, collars and any attachments.

- The officer will run their hands along each side of the collar or harness worn by the assistance animal to inspect it.
- We may ask for your consent to x-ray any bags attached to the assistance animal.
