Ben O'Donnell: Finds the information regarding the Turbo props still to be insufficient and the inability to provide forecast data remains acceptable. Requests the same level of detail as what is provided for Jets.

Neil Hall: - Explained that it can be very difficult to predict the number of turbo props over a specific area as they do not fly set tracks and vary day to day. The closer to the airport, the more numbers become more certain. This is why the data provided had numbers for the end of the runways.

Kate Frazer: Explained how operations change with Turbo props pending on where they have come from, weather, what approach is required. Would feel uncomfortable providing a forecast of numbers over suburbs because how things change from day-to-day season to season.

ACTION Neil Hall to provide *estimate* on turbo prop numbers, using average wind profile and aircraft over suburbs using todays information/ flights – also wanting it noted this information will not accurate.

Ben O'Donnell: - Accepted the offer and acknowledged the uncertainty and that is estimates and will be limited - the details that are being provided currently are insufficient.

10:10-10:30 Regular reporting updates.

Community and Industry reports

Stephen Ware: Community concerns with increasing aircraft noise. Noted the ongoing concerns for small businesses in the area,

Laurie Buys: Our community is reading and hearing the concerns of the residents under the new runway, understand there is a protest planned tomorrow by the action group, the worry is the aircraft noise will no longer be shared. The community is looking for assurance the operation of the flight paths will not return to the way it was.

Daryl Wilson: Raised correspondence sent to Ross Vasta office from residents in the electorate. Issues were around night time operations off the legacy runway, changes in the departure flight paths, requests for a new EIS flights

• Jessica Shannon: Advised that BAC has met out to one of residents following correspondence from Ross Vasta's office. JS also noted that when improvements regarding operations and noise are investigated, the entire network is examined, not particular suburbs.

Ben O'Donnell: The community are still highly concerned about flight paths and its noise.

Jessica Shannon: - Correspondence from Mr Olsen regarding the suggested outcomes from the Technical Airspace Design Workshop.

I saw on your facebook feed info on this workshop so had a look at minutes.

I noted in the Operation section there is a request from the "community" to consider an operation model where all over community flights occur on the legacy runway and the new parallel runway is only used for over water landings or departures.



As a resident that lives under the legacy runway this is not something my community would want and is at odds which information given to us by BAC during in the planning phase. We understood that our traffic would reduce as both runways would be used.

My query is who on this workshop represents the communities underneath the legacy runway or is it only parties under the new parallel runway that are involved in this process.

Jessica Shannon provided response to Mr Olsen and has had continued engagement.

Ben O'Donnell: Question: "Are BAC proposing any other avenues to try and reach what was promised to the community in the EIS with SODPROPS movements."

Michael Jarvis: Explained night over the bay operations currently are at 72.5%, EIS stated 87%. The CASA Submission regarding the tail wind is a priority. MJ also noted with reduced night time international flights, we are unable to compare numbers when we are missing a big part of the market segment."

Laurie Buys: Question: Why collect noise monitoring data and what's its use does it make a change ?

Donna Marshall: To provide information to the community on noise levels, used for post implementation reviews and to compare actual noise to earlier environmental assessments where noise modelling was used. Data from the noise monitors is also used in community responses around noise levels. Was used to put noise abatement procedures in place.

Jessica Shannon: Explained BAC Executive Leadership Team have been out in the community, including Bulimba, before and since the runway opened.
