### WHY BUILD AN AUTO MALL AT BNE?

• In line with the BAC 2025 Vision to be a world best airport offering our customers the full experience, the BNE Auto Mall.

 The BNE Auto Mall vision is to deliver a multi-purpose auto retailing hub.

 It will see flagship dealerships sitting alongside exhibition and conference activities, hotels, event area, driver training schools and regional offices around a multi-purpose performance track.



# **AN AUSTRALIAN AIRPORT FIRST**

- Brisbane Airport Corporation (BAC) is investing more than \$85 million in major earth and civil works as part of the delivery of the planned BNE Auto Mall and performance track at Brisbane Airport.
- This is the first time such a facility has been built within the grounds of an Australian airport and represents the progressive thinking behind the BNE 2025 vision to support:
- Increased connectivity
- Enhanced customer experiences
- Airport as a business hub





# **PROJECT SCOPE**

- The first phase of preparatory works involves the clearing, filling and surcharging of 51 hectares of currently unused land between Moreton and Airport Drives, close to both the International and Domestic Terminals.
- When complete the proposed land development and civil works will deliver:
- A cleared, filled, surcharged and serviced site of 38 hectares of leasable land to be divided into 27 lots.
- Fully serviced and landscaped roads providing access and connections to Airport Drive and Nancy Bird Way.
- A 2.5km certified professional performance track.

# **ROAD NETWORK**

- The construction and operation of BNE Auto Mall will create additional demand on BAC's road network.
- We have modelled the impact of the additional construction and operational traffic in relation to current and forecast traffic growth.
- BAC intends to design intersections and access points to ensure an adequate level of service is maintained.
- We will monitor the performance of the road's network through the construction and operation of the BNE Auto Mall.
- Various upgrades to intersections may be required throughout the life of the development (to be assessed on an ongoing basis).



### **BRISBANE'S NEW RUNWAY BENEFITS TO SEQ**







**90%** of construction workers live in SEQ

90% of construction materials are sourced from SEQ 675 people working directly on the project (full time) during peak periods.


