travel confidence levels, perception and outlooks



Commissioned by Brisbane Airport Corporation, this research outlines the travel confidence levels of 200+ South East Queensland (SEQ) businesses, their perceptions and concerns in today's new travel environment.

Timing

Fieldwork was conducted in June – July 2021.

Research methodology

Quantitative

- Online survey

SEQ companies were sourced via a B2B panel. A sample size of n=200 was achieved with the below criteria met:


- business located in South East Queensland catchment postcodes
- company size to be >50+ employees
- employees flying for work
- respondent to have knowledge of air travel budget

Qualitative


- 6 in-depth interviews with executives at leading corporate trave management travel agencies / blue chip companies
- qualitative participants were sourced by Brisbane Airport Corporation to represent the corporate travel industry

B2B panel partners Stable Research and Research Profile were enlisted to assist with sample collection. Leap Insight led the quantitative and qualitative interview process.

DOMESTIC TRAVEL BUDGET FY22



87% of **SEQ businesses** confirm FY22 domestic travel budget **remains**, or has increased

DOMESTIC TRAVEL TYPES



Essential travel will continue in FY22, predominantly for:

- mines
- health care sector
- construction
- sales


VACCINATION POLICY



- **41%** of employers will request travelling **staff** to be COVID-19 vaccinated
- 35% will encourage staff to be vaccinated

AIRPORT UTILISATION




74% of SEQ businesses fly solely from Brisbane Airport


